Make your own sun catcher with Kirsten Gow

Make your own sun catcher using traditional copper foil techniques during a morning or afternoon session. You will learn how the glass is cut and prepared for copper foiling before having the chance to create your own sun catcher using colours of your choice. Take your fully finished piece home on the day to brighten up any window. All materials supplied.

10th March, 10.30-12 & 1-2.30pm

Make a fused glass coaster with Catherine Lowe

Supported by the Scottish Glass Society and Craft Scotland in collaboration with West Dunbartonshire Council

On this short 1.5 hour course you will have the opportunity to learn basic glass cutting techniques, receive a brief overview of the glass fusing process and the different types of glass you will be using to make your own unique coaster.

All tools and materials will be provided and your lovely coaster will be kiln fired after the session and returned to the museum for collection the following week.

Please bring an apron and wear closed shoes.

Participants must be 14 years or over. If participant under 16 must be accompanied by an adult who will stay on site during the taster workshop. All materials supplied.

Make a glass panel with Alec Galloway
